Contractors, Unions Split Over Proposed New Apprenticeship Rule

A proposed new U.S. Dept. of Labor regulation that would reshape apprenticeship programs across a wide range of industries has drawn sharply divided reactions from construction industry groups, with unions praising the plan, a major contractor group strongly criticizing it, and at least two organizations representing contractors in certain industry sectors also welcoming the proposed rule.

The key construction provision in the proposed rule, which Labor [released](#) on June 24, would exempt the industry from taking part in so-called Industry-Recognized Apprenticeship Programs (IRAPs), "at least initially," DOL says. [View text of proposed regulation [here](#).]

The building trades unions welcomed that exemption and want to see it made permanent. But the Associated General Contractors of America and Associated Builders and Contractors want to see construction included in the program.

Proponents and opponents of the regulation will be able to weigh in with formal comments to DOL. The deadline for those submissions is Aug. 26. DOL will review those statements as it works on a final version of the rule, which is expected to take months for officials to write.

DOL says that its proposal takes a "industry-led, market-driven approach." It would allow industry groups, associations, educational institutions, states and localities, unions and other organizations to apply to DOL to become Standards Recognition Entities (SREs).

Those entities would set benchmarks for training and curricula for IRAPs in individual industries or business sectors. The SREs would be subject to DOL oversight.

That would be a shift from the long-standing current system, in which DOL registers individual apprentices and apprenticeship programs directly or via state agencies.

One goal of the Trump administration in drafting the regulation is to increase the use of apprenticeship programs in a variety of industries, particularly those where apprenticeship participation is thin.



AB 520, as amended, Kalra. Public works: public subsidy (Pending)

Existing law requires that, except as specified, not less than the general prevailing rate of per diem wages, determined by the Director of Industrial Relations, be paid to workers employed on public works projects. Existing law defines “public works” to include, among other things, construction, alteration, demolition, installation, or repair work done under contract and paid for, in whole or in part, out of public funds, but exempts from that definition, among other projects, an otherwise private development project if the state or political subdivision provides, directly or indirectly, a public subsidy to the private development project that is de minimis in the context of the project.

This bill would provide that a public subsidy is de minimis if it is both less than \$275,000 and less than 2% of the total project cost. The bill would specify that those provisions do not apply to a project that was advertised for bid, or a contract that was awarded before July 1, 2020.

AB 1533, Eggman. Public contracts: local agencies: preferences (presented to Governor)

Existing law authorizes local agencies, in facilitating contract awards, to establish preferences, in specified counties, for small businesses, disabled veteran businesses, and social enterprises, as defined.

This bill would extend that authorization to the County of San Joaquin.

This bill would make legislative findings and declarations as to the necessity of a special statute for the County of San Joaquin.

2003.

(a) Notwithstanding Section 2002 or any other law requiring a local agency to award contracts to the lowest responsible bidder, any local agency located within the Counties of Alameda, Contra Costa, Lake, Los Angeles, Marin, Napa, San Francisco, San Joaquin, San Mateo, Santa Clara, Solano, and Sonoma may do any of the following in facilitating contract awards to small businesses, disabled veteran businesses, or social enterprises:

(1) Provide for a small business, disabled veteran business, or social enterprise preference in construction, the procurement of goods, or the delivery of services where responsibility and quality are equal.

(A) The local agency shall set the percent and financial value of a preference. The maximum percentage of a preference shall be 7 percent of the lowest responsible bidder meeting specifications and the maximum financial value shall be one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) for any bid.

(B) If the local agency authorizes the use of more than one preference in a single bid, the local agency shall set the percentage and maximum financial value of the combined preferences. The maximum percentage of combined preferences shall be 15 percent of the lowest responsible bidder and the maximum combined financial value of all preferences shall be two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000).

(2) Establish a subcontracting participation goal for small businesses, disabled veteran businesses, or social enterprises on contracts and grant a preference, pursuant to paragraph (1), to those bidders who meet the goal.

(3) (A) Require bidders to make good faith efforts to meet a subcontracting participation goal for small business, disabled veteran business, or social enterprise contracts. Bidders that fail to meet the goal established by the local agency shall demonstrate that they made good faith efforts to meet the goal.

(B) A prime contractor may, subject to the approval of the local agency, substitute a subcontractor with another small business, disabled veteran business, or social enterprise, as applicable. A local agency shall approve the substitution of the subcontractor only in the instance where the substitution meets the requirements of paragraph (8) of subdivision (d) and the local agency's adopted policy.

(4) Set additional guidelines for local preference purposes.

(b) The local agency shall define the eligibility for a preference authorized pursuant to this section, which at a minimum, shall include businesses meeting the requirements of paragraph (1) of subdivision (c) as a small business, businesses meeting the requirements of paragraph (2) of subdivision (c) as a disabled veteran business, and an entity meeting the requirements of paragraph (3) of subdivision (c) as a social enterprise.

(c) For the purposes of this section:

(1) "Small business" includes, but is not limited to, a small business enterprise certified pursuant to Article 1 (commencing with Section 14835) of Chapter 6.5 of Part 5.5 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Government Code.

(2) "Disabled veteran business" includes a disabled veteran business enterprise certified pursuant to Article 6 (commencing with Section 999) of Chapter 6 of Division 4 of the Military and Veterans Code.

(3) "Social enterprise" includes a nonprofit or for-profit business whose primary purpose is to benefit the economic, environmental, or social health of the community and which uses the methods and disciplines of business and the power of the marketplace to advance its social, environmental, and human justice agendas, wherein the organization applies commercial strategies to maximize improvements in human and environmental well-being that may include maximizing social impact rather than profits for external shareholders. A "social enterprise" shall be a business that has been in operation for at least one year providing transitional or permanent employment to a transitional workforce or providing social, environmental, or human justice services. A "social enterprise" shall only include a social enterprise certified by the administering local agency or by an entity the local agency identifies in the procurement policy adopted pursuant to subdivision (d).

(4) "Transitional employment" means short-term or long-term, wage-paying, subsidized, or nonsubsidized employment that combines real work, skill development, and supportive services to help a transitional workforce overcome barriers to employment and transition to unsubsidized competitive employment.

(5) "Transitional workforce" means underemployed or hard-to-employ persons who may be homeless, formerly incarcerated, or who either have not worked for an extended period of time or face significant barriers to employment, where applicable.

(d) Every local agency that offers a preference, pursuant to this section, shall, prior to offering a preference, adopt a procurement policy that includes, at a minimum, all of the following:

(1) A definition of an eligible entity for each preference category being utilized by the local agency.

(2) The percentage and maximum financial value of a single preference.

(3) If the local agency allows multiple preferences in a bid package, the percentage and maximum financial value of multiple preferences in a bid package, if authorized by a local agency.

(4) A requirement that a preference only be awarded to a small business, disabled veteran business, or social enterprise that performs a commercially useful function, as defined in subdivision (e).

(5) A policy regarding oversight and potential fraudulent behavior on the part of a contractor, subcontractor, or individual for the purpose of qualifying as a small business, disabled veteran business, or social enterprise and being awarded a preference.

(6) If the local agency offers a preference for social enterprise participation, a certification process for social enterprises, as defined in paragraph (3) of subdivision (c).

(7) A policy for determining whether a contractor has made a good faith effort, pursuant to paragraph (3) of subdivision (a).

(8) Policy on how a prime contractor may substitute a subcontractor, pursuant to subparagraph (B) of paragraph (3) of subdivision (a). This policy shall, at a minimum, include all of the following:

(A) The identification of the condition or conditions for which a substitution of subcontractors is authorized.

(B) A requirement that construction subcontractors awarded construction subcontracts under this section shall be afforded all the protections of the Subletting and Subcontracting Fair Practices Act (Chapter 4 (commencing with Section 4100)), including a provision that in addition to substitution conditions

identified in Section 4107, a prime contractor may request substitution of a social enterprise or microbusiness, certified pursuant to Section 14837 of the Government Code, due to the subcontractor's inability to execute the contract due to staffing or scheduling conflicts that have arisen since the submittal of the bid.

(C) A requirement that a subcontractor that served to qualify the bid package for a preference shall be replaced only with a subcontractor meeting the eligibility requirements of subdivision (b).

(D) A requirement that the condition qualifying the substitution be verified with the subcontractor.

(e) Every entity used to qualify a bid for a preference pursuant to this section shall perform a commercially useful function. A "commercially useful function" means:

(1) A contractor is deemed to perform a commercially useful function if the contractor, including a subcontractor, does all of the following:

(A) Is responsible for the execution of a distinct element of the work of the contract.

(B) Carries out its obligation by actually performing, managing, or supervising the work involved.

(C) Performs work that is normal for its business services and functions.

(D) Is responsible, with respect to products, inventories, materials, and supplies required for the contract, for negotiating price, determining quality and quantity, ordering, installing, if applicable, and making payment.

(E) Is not further subcontracting a portion of the work that is greater than that expected to be subcontracted by normal industry practices.

(2) A contractor or subcontractor shall not be considered to perform a commercially useful function if the contractor's or subcontractor's role is limited to that of an extra participant in a transaction, contract, or project through which funds are passed in order to obtain the appearance of a small business, a disabled veteran business, or a social enterprise.

(f) This section shall remain in effect only until January 1, 2024, and as of that date is repealed.

SEC. 2.

The Legislature finds and declares that a special statute is necessary and that a general statute cannot be made applicable within the meaning of Section 16 of Article IV of the California Constitution because of the unique need of the County of San Joaquin to encourage small businesses, disabled veteran businesses, and social enterprises.

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Let's 'file' the rough edges off a new rule on those 'doing business as' in California. Another contractor's best laid plans crash when they get 'waived' off while another RME problem may have two 'individual' solutions pending the final test...

Q: We are a sign installation company, but we are needing to get a General Contractor's license in CA so we can be the prime contractor on our jobs. Our business name is " - - Signs". The CSLB rejected our application stating we need to register a 'dba' (doing business as) name because our company name is incompatible with our "B" classification. What is involved in registering a 'dba' name?

A: That sounds accurate! While I'm not super familiar with registering 'dba' names since this is a new requirement the CSLB implemented, it is my understanding you file the fictitious name with the County Clerk where you intend on conducting business or nearest to your business address. If you aren't going to have a CA address, you can file the 'dba' with Sacramento county. You then provide proof of the filing to the CSLB.

Q: I obtained a Corporate license about 4 years ago using a Responsible Managing Employee (RME) who was not using his personal license, with the understanding that after five years of being licensed, I (as the only Officer of the company) would be able to replace my RME on the license and request a Waiver of the exams. At my CPA's recommendation, I formed a Limited Liability Company (LLC) last year to replace the Corporation. I brought on a couple of partners, so we didn't meet the requirement to transfer the license number because the personnel changed so we ended up with a new license number. Between the two companies, it has now been five years and

I'm ready to replace my RME. Can you assist with that process and getting the approval for the Waiver?

A: We can definitely assist with the replacement process, however, unfortunately you are not going to qualify for a Waiver of the exams. In order to qualify, you have to have been an Officer/Member/Supervisory employee of the company for five out of the last seven years. You cannot use *two different entities combined* (Corp/LLC) to add up to the five years and qualify for the Waiver.

Q: Our current RME gave his notice that he will be leaving our company to start his own business, so we need to replace him on our license. He has agreed to remain on the license until we replace him. We have a couple other candidates in mind. Is the best way to proceed to have each individual obtain their own personal license, or should we just have one of them apply outright to replace the current RME? I'm just wondering if filing the replacement application automatically starts the 90-day clock ticking. We don't want our license to lapse in the event our new person doesn't pass the exam!

A: Understandable! Filing the replacement application does not automatically start the 90-day clock. If your current Qualifier has agreed to stay on board until you replace him, there is a box you can check on the replacement application to not remove him/her until the new person is *officially* added to the license.



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Safety Tip of the Week

OVERHEAD LOADS

A worker was killed the same day his wife was coming home from the hospital with their first child. How did this occur? A heavy, bulky section was being transported by a crane, which had to carry it six or seven feet in the air to clear other objects. The load was equipped with taglines, which were being used to guide it by all of the workers except this young man. Although warned by his foreman to use the line, he didn't. A lifting pad gave way and he was killed instantly.

"If it's in the air, it's dangerous." This is something to remember even if the mechanical equipment seems to be in good condition.

Let's review some of the rules that can help keep us from getting injured by falling loads:

A load that can be carried close to the ground can be stabilized by a person at each end. These individuals must stay in the clear at all times, and the ground surface must be unobstructed and reasonably level. Taglines should always be used where needed. And definitely where the load is to be carried more than five feet above the ground. In some cases, ten-foot taglines should be used to guide loads being raised and lowered, rather than using extremely long lines that drag around the job and can snag on something.

On all jobs, only one person, generally the lead person, should give signals to the crane operator. If you are assigned the job of directing the crane, follow these basic rules:

1. Stand in the clear and place yourself where the operator can plainly see you and you can see the operator.
2. If you can't see the load and another person is signaling to you, be sure everyone is in the clear before you give the signal to the operator. Remember, it takes time to relay signals.
3. Never permit a load to be lowered, raised, or swung over a worker's head. If the operator can see the load, it's the operator's responsibility - without exception - to see that this rule is followed.
